





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ANDREA McARDLE (Belle) is delighted to be back on Broadway having starred in Les Misérables, Starlight Express and, most recently, State Fair. She is best known, though, as the original Annie (both on Broadway and in London), a performance which earned her a Tony Award nomination for Best Actress in a Musical, in addition to a Theatre World and Outer Critics Circle Award. Her other stage appearances across the country include starring roles in *Oliver!*, Annie Get Your Gun, Joseph... Dreamcoat, and Jerry's Girls among others. Ms. McArdle has headlined in Atlantic City (most recently at the Tropicana Casino), toured with the late Liberace and the great Bob Hope and had the privilege of singing for every U.S. President from Ford to Clinton. She is married to composer/producer Edd Kalehoff and their daughter, Alexis, is one of her frequent co-stars.

STEVE BLANCHARD (Beast). Mr. Blanchard is the first actor to have been asked to portray both of Disney's Beauty and the Beast's leading men, having played the role of Gaston for over a year. 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
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
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
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
