

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Catherine: Right from the first meeting I had a copy of a schedule. I had most of my life mapped out by Judy, but though she obviously had strong ideas, she gave me a very open brief: 'You create the story, you create the characters, you use whichever songs will suit you best. If you decide to go with the 25 utterly unknown ABBA songs, that's fine.' I got copies of every single lyric that Björn had ever written and very quickly established that the reason why the hits were the hits was because they *were* the best songs and lent themselves completely to being used to tell a story.

trickery when they start singing. That's great if you've got clever lyrics, but Björn's lyrics are very straightforward. They express what you could easily say yourself. They don't wrap the emotions up in such a way that you might think, 'That's a lovely way of putting it but I wouldn't have thought of that'. Whereas 'Breaking up is never easy, but I have to go, it's the best I can do' – I could say that, anybody could say that in real life. That proved extremely useful, because I knew that my dialogue and his lyrics were not going to bump up against each other. It would be terribly difficult to do the same thing with Leonard Cohen's songs, for example.

As well as developing the characters, I needed to find the right location. At that time I'd never really been abroad. I prefer to have been somewhere to write about it; this was the first time I had had to work with no idea of the location whatsoever. I started off by just writing 'An island' and in the process the location was somewhere off Australia, then the Caribbean. I think there was even one discussion about whether it should be Canvey Island, or something equally silly. Only much later in the day did it become a Greek island and I still had to write the script with only a collection of holiday brochures to consult.

I remember telling Catherine, 'The story is more important than the songs. You can choose any of these 100 songs, not just the hits – but there are a few I will say "No" to, that I refuse to have in any show!' Björn Ulvaeus

Judy: I think, or I hope, that if Catherine had gone away and come up with something featuring 'Hey, Hey Helen' and 'King Kong Song', I'd have given it equal consideration... Nevertheless, the hit songs do stand out, even though the whole point was not about simply throwing all the hits in.

Catherine: I did have the chance to listen to the whole back catalogue of ABBA CDs, but I felt the only way I could make this work was to pretend that these were my songs and not ABBA's. I didn't want to be influenced by hearing the ABBA voices singing them, so I just sat and read the lyrics. I found a voice in those lyrics, the voice that Björn had used as his storytelling voice, the voice of a woman. With a few exceptions, Björn was writing lyrics that he was not going to sing himself – he had written the songs for Agnetha and Anni-Frid – so he was going through a similar process to me, creating characters. Once Td realised that, I knew I had to find the characters who could speak like songs.

In some musicals you find people talking in a fairly straightforward way before breaking into all kinds of verbal The essential concept has stayed remarkably consistent from the very beginning: Donna, this feisty single mum, runs a taverna on a Greek island. Her only daughter Sophie is about to get married and Donna's old friends Tanya and Rosie, who she'd sung with during the 1970s in a group called Donna and the Dynamos, have arrived for the celebrations. Sophie wants her father to give her away, but she doesn't know who her father is, and so she has invited three ex-loves of Donna's – her three potential dads – to come out for the wedding... BJÖRN ULVAEUS

Björn Kristian Ulvaeus was born in Gothenburg on 25 April 1945. When he was six the family moved to the small town of Västervik, and this is where Biorn arew up. In the mid-1950s Biorn fell in love with rock 'n' roll and skiffle. By the early 1960s he was a member of a folk group called the West Bay Singers. In 1963 they entered a talent contest arranged by Swedish radio. This led to discovery by songwriter and publisher Stig Anderson and his partner, Bengt Bernhag. Stig and Bengt had recently started a record company called Polar Music. The band acquired a new name, the Hootenanny Singers, and guickly became one of Sweden's most popular groups of the 1960s. In 1966, Björn had a chance meeting with Benny Andersson, himself a member of Sweden's No 1 pop group, The Hep Stars. They hit it off and wrote their first song together, 'Isn't It Easy to Say'. Björn recorded a couple of solo singles in the late 1960s, at which point he also started concentrating more on his collaboration with Benny Andersson. In 1970 the pair started releasing records as a duo and staged a cabaret show together with their fiancées, Agnetha Fältskog and Anni-Frid Lyngstad. On 6 July 1971, Björn and Agnetha got married.

In the decade from 1972 onwards Björn was occupied by his work with ABBA. In 1983 Björn and Benny started writing the musical *Chess* with lyricist Tim Rice. A concept album was released in the autumn of 1984, and in May 1986 the musical opened in the West End. In 1988 *Chess* received its Broadway première. A reworked version of the musical opened in Stockholm, Sweden, in 2002. By 1990, Björn and Benny had decided to write a new musical. This time they wanted to write exclusively in Swedish, and they chose the *Emigrants* novel series by author Vilhelm Moberg as the basis for their work. The musical *Kristina från Duvemåla* (*Kristina from Duvemåla*) opened in October 1995. The show ran for three and a half years at theatres in the Swedish cities of Malmö, Gothenburg and Stockholm.

Recently, Björn has involved himself heavily in the staging of *MAMMA MIA!*, a musical based on ABBA songs. The show opened in London in April 1999 and has since then been staged virtually everywhere, even being turned into a movie which opened in July 2008.

GÖRAN BROR BENNY ANDERSSON

Born 16 December 1946 in Stockholm. 1952 Received accordion lessons from his father and grandfather.

1964-68 Member of The Hep Stars, Sweden's most popular rock band in the 1960s. During this time, he began composing music. 'Sunny Girl' and 'Wedding' were huge hits for The Hep Stars. 1972-82 ABBA.

1982-84 Composed the music (together with Björn Ulvaeus) for the musical *Chess.* 1987 Began collaborating with Orsa Spelmän. Recorded three albums deeply rooted in Swedish folk music: *Klinga Mina Klockor, November 1989* and *Fiolen Min.* In 2001, this collaboration led to the formation of Benny Anderson's Orchestra, a 16-man constellation with vocalists Helen Sjöholm and Tommy Körberg. Thus far, this has resulted in three CD albums and several summer tours. 1990-95 Composed the music to *Kristina from Duvemåla.* Premiered in October 1995.

1995 Received the title of professor from the Swedish government.

Inducted into the Royal Swedish Academy of Music in 2007.

Appointed Honorary Doctor of the College of Humanities at Stockholm University in 2008.

Benny Andersson is married to former television producer Mona Nörklit. They have one child, Ludvig Andersson. Benny Andersson also has two children from a previous marriage, Peter Grönvall and Helene Odedal. He has five grandchildren: Charlie, Felix, Fabian, Malin and Viola.





JUDY CRAYMER



In 1987, Judy decided to pursue a career in film and television where she produced and developed television drama and comedy. The idea of MAMMA MIA! was originated by Judy who in 1996 formed Littlestar Services Ltd with Benny Andersson, Björn Ulvaeus and Richard East, to produce the stage musical. She is the Producer of MAMMA MIA! and has produced 34 productions around the world. In 2002, Judy was presented with a Woman of the Year Award in recognition of her international success with MAMMA MIA! The same year the show was nominated for a Tony Award for Best Musical. In The Queen's birthday honours list of 2007, she was honoured with an MBE for her contribution to the music industry. Judy produced MAMMA MIA! THE MOVIE starring Meryl Streep and Pierce Brosnan, which became the highest grossing musical film worldwide. In 2008 Judy was honoured with the Women in Film ITV Achievement of the Year Award.

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
